\$5,000 available for tertiary students

The NSW Farmers' Association is encouraging tertiary students to get their applications in for the 2010 Tertiary Scholarship program, with the deadline of 26 February approaching.

NSW Farmers' Association Rural Affairs Committee Chair Sarah Thompson says the program offers tertiary students relief from some of the financial pressures associated with studying.

"It comes as no surprise that cost is a major barrier for country students attending university, particularly in the current financial climate and drought," Ms Thompson said.

"Our scholarships, each worth \$5000, are our way of helping to ease the financial burden and invest in the future of rural NSW.

"We hope that the scholarship winners will return to country NSW following their studies and use the skills they have gained to strengthen rural communities.

"It's a case of you have to be in it to win it, and we are urging all eligible tertiary students to put their applications in as soon as possible so they don't miss out," Ms Thompson said.

Applications are open to Association Members, partners of Members or children of Members, who are full-time students undertaking full time courses in their second or subsequent year of study at a recognised tertiary institution. The applicant, their partner or their parents must have been full Members of the Association for at least the past two years to qualify for a scholarship.

"Applicants will be judged on their academic record, leadership qualities, community involvement, communication skills and their commitment to making a lasting contribution to both agriculture and rural communities," Ms Thompson said.

Scholarships are funded by the Association and the Goobang Group, and the recipients will be announced at the Association's Annual Conference in July.
